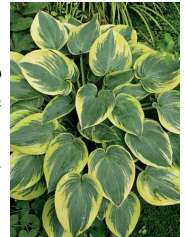
'Earth Angel'-AMERICAN HOSTA GROWER'S ASSOCIATION 2009 HOSTA OF THE YEAR

mound: 26" high by 50" wide *leaves:* 13" long by 10" wide; blue-green in the center with a 1 1/2" wide, yellow margin; thick substance *flowering:* near-white flowers in dense clusters on three to four foot scapes from late June into mid-July
growing: medium growth
Rate. *General comments:* tremendous breakthrough plant, i.e., the first yellowedged sport out of 'Blue Angel'; magnificent specimen plant



'First Frost'-AMERICAN HOSTA GROWER'S ASSOCIATION 2010 HOSTA OF THE YEAR

plant size: 14" high by 36" wide *leaves:* 7" long by 5" wide; center blue in spring, gradually turning dark green; 1/4" to 1/2" wide margin gold in spring, turning creamy white; good substance *flowering:* very pale lavender flowers from late July into mid-August on 24-30" scapes *growing:* medium growth rate;
General comments: margined sport of 'Halcyon' from Patricia Scolnik of North Carolina; foliage colors change from a combination of blue (center) with gold (margin) to dark green & creamy white; good grower in containers and in the garden.



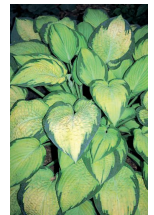
'June'-AMERICAN HOSTA GROWER'S ASSOCIATION 2001 HOSTA OF THE YEAR

mound: 12" high by 30" wide *leaves:* 6" long by 4" wide; gold center; blue-green margins, 1/4"-1/2" wide; thick substance *flowering:* pale lavender flowers open on 20" scapes from late July into August
growing: medium to slow growth rate. *General comments:* gold-centered sport of 'Halcyon', making this hosta a variegated Tardiana-type; unusual and distinct



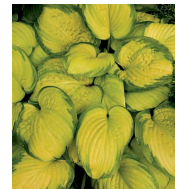
'Paul's Glory'-AMERICAN HOSTA GROWER'S ASSOCIATION 1999 HOSTA OF THE YEAR

mound: 25" high by 55" wide *leaves:* 10" long by 7" wide; 1/2" wide, dark green margin surrounding the center which changes from chartreuse in spring to creamy white by mid-summer; moderately corrugated; good substance *flowering:* pale lavender flowers open on scapes reaching 35" high; mid-July to early August *growing:* medium growth rate. *General comments:* vivid foliage colors, good substance, and attractive mound habit; found by Paul Hofer of Ohio; sensational as a specimen plant in the landscape



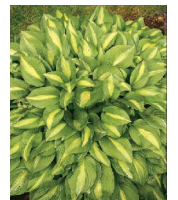
'Stained Glass'-AMERICAN HOSTA GROWER'S ASSOCIATION 2006 HOSTA OF THE YEAR

mound: 20" high by 45" wide *leaves:* 9" long by 7" wide; medium gold center with a 1" wide green margin *flowering:* fragrant, pale lavender flowers on 30-36" scapes in August *growing:* medium growth rate. *General comments:* striking sport of 'Guacamole'; brilliant gold-centered foliage all season long; the ideal specimen plant



'Striptease'-AMERICAN HOSTA GROWER'S ASSOCIATION 2005 HOSTA OF THE YEAR

mound: 20" high by 48" wide *leaves:* 8" long by 6" wide; 2" wide gold center surrounded by a 2" dark green margin with a distinct, white line between; good substance *flowering:* pale lavender flowers in July on 20-36" scapes from mid-July into August *growing:* fast growth rate. *General comments:* breakthrough tetraploid developed by Rick & Criss Thompson in the early 1990s; increasingly rare due to propagation difficulties and problems with Hosta Virus X at some nurseries; our material has tested negative for known hosta viruses, including HVX

The LET'S GET ACQUAINTED- COLLECTION 1

'Captain Kirk'-*mound*: 23" high by 43" wide *leaves*: 8" long by 7" wide; 2" wide, dark green margin, 3" wide gold center *flowering*: pale lavender flowers in July on three-foot scapes *growing*: medium to fast growth rate. *General comments*: sport of 'Gold Standard' with very wide margins; distinct from mother plant and 'Striptease' (another 'Gold Standard' sport); from Kirk Brill of Des Moines, Iowa



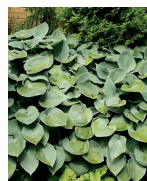
'Fried Green Tomatoes'- *mound*: 26" high by 60" wide *leaves*: 12" long by 9" wide; rich green color (bluish early) *flowering*: fragrant, pale lavender flowers are produced on 40" scapes throughout August *growing*: fast growth rate. *General comments*: green-leaved sport of 'Guacamole'; vigorous grower in the garden and as a container plant; another Bob Solberg introduction



'Great Arrival'- *mound*: 26" high by 50" wide *leaves*: 13" long by 10" wide; blue-green center; 1/2" to 3/4" margin that is bright gold in spring, turning creamy white by mid-summer; heavily corrugated; broadly ovate blade; thick substance *flowering*: near-white flowers from late June into mid-July on 24-30" scapes *growing*: medium to slow growth rate. *General comments*: a reversed form of 'Great Expectations' developed at Q & Z Nursery; does not develop spring desiccation burn; named by Alex Summers



'Halcyon'-*mound*: 16" high by 40" wide *leaves*: 8" long by 5 1/2" wide; deep blue-green color; thick substance *flowering*: very pale lavender flowers from late July into mid-August on scapes topping 28" *growing*: medium growth rate. *General comments*: outstanding blue foliage color and good slug resistance; forms a dense mound; great ground cover or edging plant; Tardiana hybrid (TF 1 x 7)



'Sum and Subtle' *mound*: 22" high by 40" wide; spreading habit *leaves*: 12" long by 10" wide; gold-centered with a margin that changes from chartreuse to medium green; thick substance; corrugated at maturity *flowering*: pale lavender flowers produced on 40" scapes in August *growing*: medium growth rate *key features*: large mound size; thick substance; subtle variegation pattern. *General comments*: sport of 'Sum and Substance' developed at our nursery; probably will reach greater than our listed dimensions over time; foliage colors intensify with exposure to bright light



'Wheaton Blue'- *mound*: 26" high by 50" wide *leaves*: 10" long by 7" wide; medium blue-green color; better than average substance *flowering*: pale lavender flowers open on 32" scapes from mid to late July *growing*: medium to fast growth rate. *General comments*: blue-green sport of 'Paul's Glory'; handsome mound of blue foliage

'Blaze of Glory'- *mound*: 20" high by 44" wide *leaves*: 11" long by 8" wide; lemony gold; slightly wavy; good substance *flowering*: near white flowers in July *growing*: medium growth rate; *General comments*: "vivid" best describes this bright gold 'Pin Stripe' seedling from Ed Elslager; something different in a gold



'Jubilee'- *mound*: 18" high by 35" wide *leaves*: 8" long by 4" wide; dark green in the center with a 1/2" wide, yellow margin *flowering*: lavender flowers in July on two foot scapes *growing*: fast growth *General comments*: richly variegated and fast growing cultivar; another seedling selection from Dick and Jane Ward



'Mojito'-*mound*: 24" high by 52" wide *leaves*: 12" long by 8" wide; shiny and smooth; emerald green *Color flowering*: fragrant, pale lavender flowers in August on three foot scapes *growing*: fast growth rate. *General comments*: fast-growing, rich green sport of 'Avocado' offering thick substance and beautifully fragrant flowers; pairs well with 'Cerveza'



Ocean Isle'-*plant size*: 26" high by 55" wide *leaves*: wide gold margin surrounds a bluish green to dark green center; 12" long by 10" wide; thick substance *flowering*: pale lavender flowers in July on three-foot scapes *growing*: medium to slow growth rate. *General comments*: green-centered, gold-edged sport of 'El Dorado' found by Dave Chopko of Boonton, New Jersey; winner of the "Frances Williams Award" as top sport of the 2004 "First Look" seedling and sport competition; non-burning, slug-resistant, gold-edged, *H. sieboldiana*-type



'Orange Marmalade'-*mound*: 20" high by 45" wide *leaves*: 7 1/2" long by 5 1/2" wide; 1/2" wide blue-green margin; center bright gold as it emerges from soil, becoming lighter during the season with bright light *flowering*: pale lavender flowers on three foot scapes from mid-July into early August *growing*: medium growth rate. *General comments*: outstanding sport of 'Paul's Glory' from Bob Solberg of Green Hill Farm, Chapel Hill, NC (2002 AHS registration); has all of the great characteristics of its mother plant, but improves on it by its bright gold center leaf color as it emerges from the soil in spring



'Powder Blue'-*mound*: 26" high by 60" wide *leaves*: 14" long by 11" wide; rich, blue-green; heavily corrugated; thick substance *flowering*: lavender flowers from late June into mid-July on 30-36" scapes *growing*: medium to slow growth rate; liners can be potted directly into quart or 1-gallon containers early in the season; from July on, transplant liners into 2 1/4" pots and after six weeks step up into 1-gallon pots *General comments*: aptly named seedling with Japanese origins developed by Peter Ruh of Chesterland, Ohio; becomes a huge, broad mound of slug resistant, powdery blue foliage
