For herbs: Dill, Cumin, Bay Laurel, Chicory, Sage, Lemongrass, Mint, flowers graced the Bible's natural world, Violet, Delphinium, Hibiscus, Hollyhock and Lupines.

A Children's Garden

Zinnias, Sunflowers, Marigolds, Beans, Corn, Pumpkins, Gourds, Nasturtium, pansies, Strawflowers, Snapdragons, Chives, Cherry Tomatoes and peas.

Crafter's Garden

Baby's Breath, Artemisia absinthium, Yarrow, Lavender, Annual Statice, Germen Statice, and Sweet Annie (Artemisia annua).

Tea Herb Garden

Peppermint, Spearmint, Lemon Verbena, Bee Balm, Chamomile, Pineapple Sage, Anise Hyssops, Lemon grass, Lemon Balm, Chocolate Mint, pineapple mint, and Borage.

Lemon Balm, Chamomile, Lemon Balm, Calendula (2008 Herb Of The Year) Sage, Fennel, Dill, Borage, Basil, Borage, Peppermint, Rosemary, and Thyme.
